WHAT QUALIFIES AS A FIRST-GENERATION COLLEGE STUDENT?

A first-gen college student is defined as someone for whom neither parent/guardian has completed a 4-year college degree.

DO I NEED TO RE-APPLY FOR THE SCHOLARSHIP EACH YEAR?

No, the \$20,000 award will be renewed each year that you are at Suffolk Law so long as you remain in good academic standing.

IS \$20,000 THE MAXIMUM AMOUNT OF MERIT AID I CAN RECEIVE?

No, students with competitive GPAs and standardized test scores may be awarded more than \$20,000 per year.

WHEN IS MY APPLICATION DUE?

Our priority deadline is April 1, 2025. There is no separate application needed to be considered for the First-Generation Scholarship.
