ADVANCED CREDIT INFORMATION

Suffolk awards advanced credit for a wide range of exam scores, including:

- Advanced Placement scores ranging from 3 to 5
- HL and SL exams (IB Diploma recipients with at least 28 total points). A score of at least 4 is required from each eligible exam.
- Scores of 4 through 7 for each higher-level IB exam (for students with fewer than 28 points or those who earned the IB Certificate)
- A-Level scores of C- and higher (Five strong GCSE/IGCSE passes are required for admission.)
- Other examinations such as the French Baccalaurate, German Abitur, Swiss Matura, and Caribbean Advanced Proficiency Examination
- College/University courses completed with a C- or better. Courses must be similar in content to those at Suffolk and taken at an institution recognized by the Ministry of Education or by a U.S. regionally accredited institution.

If you're a domestic student, it's your decision whether to submit your SAT or ACT score report. We also offer test-flexible options for international students. Suffolk's codes for official test results are:

SUFFOLK'S INVESTMENT IN YOU

Whether you're a domestic or international applicant, we'll automatically consider you for institutional merit-based aid. Plus, you may qualify for one or more of our dozens of Suffolk scholarships, like these:

Dean's Scholarship

This merit-based scholarship is awarded to full-time entering freshmen and transfer students. A minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 is required for renewal.

Trustees Scholarship

Suffolk's largest institutionally funded program is available to undergraduates based on demonstrated financial need.

Gleason Archer Scholarship

Named in honor of Suffolk's founder, this program helps Massachusetts students with financial need and academic promise. The scholarship is awarded to qualified incoming students who submit the FAFSA.

First-Generation Scholarship

All eligible first-generation freshmen qualify for this \$1,000 scholarship.

Suffolk Tuition Promise

Avoid annual tuition increases by maintaining a GPA of 3.6 or higher.

Summer Career Development Stipend

Available to full-time freshmen and transfer students, this \$3,500 stipend supports them as they pursue unpaid internships, research with faculty, or other volunteer service opportunities.
